Community Safety Officers have successful first year

anuary marked one year in operation for the East St. Paul Safety Officer Program and it's been a productive and successful year.

"The first year of the Community Safety Officer Program has been a great success. We've seen a meaningful impact on public safety, reduced crime rates, and an increased sense of security within our community," says Mayor Carla Devlin.

"The partnership between our CSOs and the RCMP has been instrumental in achieving these results, and I want to thank the officers for their dedication and commitment to East St. Paul. We look forward to continuing to build on this momentum."

The Manitoba Safety Officer Program is a community-driven approach to improving safety and well-being. One of the core princi-

ples of the program is maintaining high visibility within the community, a proven method of reducing crime rates. Because Community Safety Officers (CSOs) work closely with the RCMP, they are able to respond very quickly when calls come in.

The RCMP and CSOs have formed a partnership that allows them to work together to make East St. Paul a safer community.

The program has been well received by residents who have had contact with the CSOs. Like anything new, when the program began in January 2024, there were a lot of questions. But through high visibility patrols and help with

a social media presence, the community has come to appreciate the extra level of security.

During the year, several new programs aimed at community safety were initiated.

Vacation Home Patrol Program

Since the inception of the Vacation Home Patrol Program, CSOs have been attending residences to ensure there is no suspicious activity and will ensure your home is secure while you are on vacation. This initiative has been well-received, and to date, the CSOs have not had to report any breakins to the RCMP, highlighting the effectiveness of this proactive approach.

Buy and Sell Exchange

For residents engaging in online sales, the CSOs have

implemented a Buy and Sell Exchange Zone in the RM Administration Building parking lot (3021 Birds Hill Road). This designated, monitored area allows for safe transactions, with surveillance cameras ensuring peace of mind for both buyers and sellers. The response to this initiative has been overwhelmingly positive, and it's proving to be an effective crime prevention measure.

The CSOs took part in the ESP Day parade, engaging with community members and further strengthening their presence in the neighborhood. This was a great opportunity for the CSOs to connect directly with residents and show their ongoing commitment to community

The CSOs assisted with the roadblock for the car-free Halloween event and took the opportunity to remind attendees of Halloween safety.

During the Christmas season, the CSOs participated in the RM's festivities, including escorting the Santa Float, ensuring the event was safe and enjoyable for all.

Relationships with the schools in East St.

The CSOs are fostering strong relationships with students and staff of Birds Hill Elementary School, Dr. F.W.L Hamilton Elementary,

and Robert Andrews Middle Schools. Through ongoing collaboration with the Winnipeg Police School Resource Officer, the CSOs are helping to create safer school environments and engage with students and staff to build trust and

Traffic Safety

The CSOs have been actively conducting traffic enforcement in the municipality, which has resulted in more than 1,500 traffic stops. In some cases, offense notices are issued; however, quite often, the CSOs take the opportunity to educate the drivers on improving their driving habits. The CSO program has relied on the public to identify traffic problems within the municipality. Motor vehicle collisions in the RM of East St. Paul were trending upwards

post-COVID but were down 15% in 2024.

Calls for Service and By-Law Enforcement

The CSOs have responded to a total of 858 calls for service, including 540 calls related to bylaw investigations. In addition, they issued 246 offense notices related to Traffic By-law violations, with the most common offense being trucks off the designated Truck Route.



Fire Department records busiest year to date in 2024

o24 proved to be the busiest year yet for East St. Paul Fire Department. The fire department responded to a total of 430 calls which averaged to over 35 calls per month.

The graph/table at right provides a comparison for the past five years. It should be noted there is a marked decrease in the number of calls recorded in 2020 due to changed medical protocols as a result of the covid pandemic.

The total calls for each year are:

2020 - 177

2021 - 347

2022 - 395

2023 - 398

2024 - 430

The number of calls per month was as follows:

April - 28


May - 44

The top five types of calls in 2024 were medical (279 calls, 65% of total), motor vehicle accidents (55 calls, 13%), fire alarms (50 calls, 12%), CO calls (11 calls, 3%), and vehicle fires (7 calls, 2%).

In addition, the fire department attended to 6 structure fires.

February Artist of the Month-Edith Muzyka


dith has had a lifelong interest in nature. This interest was inspired by her father, André, who was a farmer in the Parkland area of the province.
